What do I do with..?

Computers and TVs
Drop off at Kimbriki Resource Recovery Centre, Belrose Resource Recovery Centre or Harvey Norman Balgowlah

Food waste

How do I present my vegetation?

Offshore communities receive two scheduled vegetation collections per year (refer to calendar for dates). **Vegetation must be presented in tied bundles or hard sided containers the weekend before the scheduled collection date.**

Mackerel Beach residents

If you have road access, please place your vegetation at the road reserve outside your property. For those properties facing the waterfront from 14-34 Ross Smith Parade, place your vegetation at the northern corner of Monash and Ross Smith Parade.

Other Western Foreshore residents

For properties located on Elvina Trail (McCarrs Creek), Warringulla Avenue (Elvina), Sturdee Lane (North Elvina, South Lovett Bay), Bona Crescent (Lovett Bay East, Morning Bay) excluding 12 - 34 Bona Crescent, please place your vegetation at the road reserve outside your property. For those properties located at West Lovett and Portions, Bonnie Doon and Coasters Retreat, 12 - 34 Bona Crescent and The Chase, Lovett Bay, place your vegetation at the public wharf*.

*If your collection location is a public wharf, please secure vegetation at the wharf's entrance point to avoid spillage and ensure clear access for pedestrians.

Please contact Council if you need to **report a damaged or missing bin**, or see any **illegal dumping**.

Garbage

Every Monday and Friday public and private wharves with year round tidal access

- ✓ Broken windows / mirrors
- ✓ Drinking glass / ceramics

- ✗ Hazardous waste
- ✗ Recyclable items
- ✗ Computer equipment
- ✗ Asbestos
- ✗ Batteries
- ✗ Gas cylinders

Paper Recycling

Every Monday and Friday public and private wharves with year round tidal access

- ✓ Paper
- ✓ Newspaper / magazines
- ✓ Flattened cardboard
- ✓ Envelopes
- ✓ Window envelopes
- ✓ Egg cartons

- ✗ Plastic bags
- ✗ Waxed cardboard
- ✗ Food waste
- ✗ Food soiled paper
- ✗ Milk / juice cartons
- ✗ Polystyrene

Container Recycling

Every Monday and Friday public and private wharves with year round tidal access

- ✓ Clean containers including:
- ✓ Glass jars / bottles
- ✓ Milk / juice cartons
- ✓ Empty aerosols
- ✓ Steel / aluminium cans
- ✓ Plastic containers

- ✗ Plastic bags / cling wrap
- ✗ Food waste
- ✗ Windows / glass / mirrors
- ✗ Ceramics / drinking glass
- ✗ Polystyrene
- ✗ White glass

Vegetation

Twice yearly service

- ✓ Branches max 75mm wide
- ✓ Branches max 1.2m long
- ✓ Garden / grass clippings
- ✓ Cut up palm fronds
- ✓ Twigs / leaves
- ✓ Flowers

- ✗ General waste
- ✗ Food waste
- ✗ Plastic bags
- ✗ Painted / treated timber
- ✗ Soil
- ✗ Large tree stumps

Bin and hoop stands

You may request a bin and hoop stand to be installed on your private wharf/jetty if your property has year round tidal access. **This is a free service for garbage collection only.**

Recycling crates

You may request a **new or replacement recycling crate for free.**

Don't send all your items to landfill - give them a second life.

Consider the many ways you can sell, recycle or upcycle before you present your items for collection. For tips to reduce your waste, visit Council's website.

Bulky Goods Collection Service

Offshore communities receive **two scheduled bulky goods collections per year**. Materials must only be placed out the weekend before the scheduled bulky goods collection date.



Hot water systems **must be emptied**



Large items **must be dismantled** so two people can load



Paint tins and fuel containers are accepted **empty, with the lid off**



Ensure **nails are not protruding** from any items



Manageable quantities of **non branded delivery pallets** are accepted



Remove glass from frames (break glass, wrap in paper and place in garbage bin)



Items must **not be longer than 1.5m or heavier than 40kg** (except whitegoods when noted in booking)



Doors are removed from fridges and other whitegoods

- ✗ TVs & computers
- ✗ Building / renovation material
- ✗ Car parts, tyres & batteries
- ✗ Gas bottles & fire extinguishers
- ✗ Vegetation
- ✗ Cardboard & paper
- ✗ Windows / glass / mirrors
- ✗ Items smaller than a toaster
- ✗ Hazardous waste
- ✗ Polystyrene beads

Mackerel Beach residents place materials within the temporary fenced grassed area at the southern side of the public wharf. There will be a separate fenced section for metals.

Other Western Foreshore residents place materials at the public wharves. If you have a private wharf waste service and year round tidal access you can place your material on your wharf/jetty/pontoon.
